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CRESCENT CITY JAYCEES ANNUAL EIGHT GRADE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Crescent City Jaycees have established a Tournament Scholarship Trust account for the purpose of awarding scholarships to tournament participants.

The selection process shall be as follows:

1. The top 3 players elected to the All-Tournament Team including the MVP in each division. The total number eligible would be up to 21 players.
2. The top 3 cheerleaders elected to the All-Tournament Team in each division, the Most Outstanding Mascot(s) over all divisions, and the 1st and 2nd runner up Mascot(s). The total number eligible would be up to 21 cheerleaders and up to 6 mascots.
3. All princesses attending the tournament will be eligible.

Scholarships that will be made available to the above qualifiers will be:

At least one \$500.00 scholarship for players

At least one \$500.00 scholarship for cheerleaders and mascots

At least one \$500.00 scholarship for princesses

Final selection for each scholarship will be made upon the student's successful completion of High School with at least a B average or equivalent grade point, application to the Crescent City Jaycees and enrollment into the college of their choice. The Crescent City Jaycees will award the scholarship to the most outstanding applicant in each of the three categories.

FUNDING

The Crescent City Jaycees suggest that each team solicit a sponsor hi then: local community who will make a \$30.00 donation in their behalf to the Crescent City Jaycees for the Scholarship Trust Account.

Each cheer team may solicit a sponsor hi their local community who will make a \$20.00 donation in their behalf to the Crescent City Jaycees for the Scholarship Trust Account.

Each princess attending the tournament will have a \$20.00 scholarship sponsor fee that will be placed into the Scholarship Trust Account. If they wish to solicit a sponsor, they may do so at their option.

The Crescent City Jaycees will contribute at least the amount needed to insure the total amount pledged is secured in the Scholarship Trust Account. As the account grows, the Crescent City Jaycees may, at their option, award larger scholarships or increase the number of scholarships awarded.

Scholarship sponsors may be a business, parent, or friend who wishes to support this effort. The Crescent City Jaycees will devote a full page in the program to recognize all of the scholarship sponsors. However, sponsors checks and names must be submitted by the deadline in order to be included in the program.

Sponsors checks must be made out to the Crescent City Jaycees and must be separate from entry fee checks.



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CRESCENT CITY JAYCEES ANNUAL EIGHT GRADE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT QUEEN COMPETITION RULES

The Queen contestants are to be picked by each school who wishes to participate prior to tournament. They will come to the tournament representing their school. In order to involve as many girls as possible in the tournament, our committee has decided that no cheer team member or mascot may be a Queen contestant, unless their school has less than 10 girls in the Eighth Grade Class. Contestants may be either a seventh grader or eighth grader. Students lower than seventh grade will not be eligible to compete. **The Parent/Advisor meeting takes place on Friday afternoon at 3:30 pm at Del Norte High School.**

Each girl will complete and return the enclosed resume and princess entry form along with a recent photo of their self. Photos may be e-mailed please see "PHOTO INSTRUCTIONS" The resume and entry form should be returned to the person indicated below by:

The judging will take place at an informal Brunch located at the: **To Be Determined**

On Saturday, at 10:00 a.m. The Queen Contestants and their advisors are invited to attend. There will be no formal panel of judges to confront the girls. They will visit with each judge on a one to one basis. This will be as informal and comfortable as possible.

The girls will be judged on such criteria as appearance, poise, school spirit, ability to converse with the judges, naturalness and their resume.

The Queen Contestants should wear simple school dresses or sweaters, blouses and skirts. Dresses or skirts should be at the knee or longer. Please advise them against wearing pants or party dresses. Judges are instructed to mark down anyone who is overdressed. Cleanliness and neatness will count more than a fancy new dress. Panty hose and a low heel shoe will be allowed. Make-up should be very light. Please remember this is not a beauty pageant.

The crowning of the Queen will take place on Saturday afternoon immediately following the cheer teams Saturday afternoon routines as shown on the Schedule of Events. Contestants are required to wear the same outfit that was worn to the Brunch.

All Queen Contestants will assist in handing out the awards at the conclusion of the tournament. Contestants are again required to wear the same outfit that was worn at the Brunch and Crowning of the Queen.

All Queen Contestants can and do contribute to the Sportsmanship Award and are included in the Secret Friend Hunt.

Cheerleaders, mascots and princesses attendance at the practice party is mandatory. You will not be judged at this party. It is a practice party. Princesses will be introduced to everyone in attendance. This will be a great opportunity for princesses to find their secret friends.

There will be a \$3.00 entry fee and a \$30.00 scholarship sponsor fee for each princess entered into the competition. Please review the enclosed information sheet regarding our scholarship program.

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Photo Instructions

Photos need to be sharp and clear so they can be re-produced for the program. A fuzzy picture will look worse when re-produced.

Choose a background area that is plain and does not blend in with your subject's faces. Avoid any shadows that cover faces.

A team or group photo should be taken as close as possible, use as much of the picture as you can. We really do not need a lot of background or foreground. Team photos are much better if they are 2 or 3 rows instead of one long single row. Cheerleader photos are good with the group in a close stack, kneel down, etc. Remember to identify members in your photo (left to right, 1st row, 2nd row, etc.).

Digital camera photos are preferred. Many "One Hour" photo shops also give the option of developing pictures onto a CD. This is also acceptable. Photos should be e-mailed to: photos@ccjaycees.org.

We put a lot of time, effort and expense into our program and we hope you will not be disappointed with the results. However, if your photo is not good quality, you probably will be disappointed with the re-production.

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SECRET FRIEND HUNT

What is the purpose of the Secret Friend # as shown on your roster? It is a simple way to promote friendship and sportsmanship between cheer teams and princesses from all different schools. When we have all the rosters turned in, we assign a number to each cheerleader, alternate, manager and mascot on the roster. We also assign each princess a number. Three of the above participants will be assigned the same number. They will all be from different schools. The most opportune time to find their secret friends will be on Friday night at the cheer team practice party. We will provide some time for the exchange of addresses, phone numbers, e-mail, etc. Please do NOT bring gifts, this is just a mixer exercise. At 2:40 P.M., during the Saturday afternoon cheer competition, we will ask all participants to assemble on the Del Norte High School Gym floor with their new friends. At that time, we will draw a number and the three participants who have that number will be awarded a prize.



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SPORTSMANSHIP AND PARTICIPATION AWARD

The Sportsmanship and Participation Trophy is a perpetual award. The winner of the award is allowed to keep the trophy until the next year's tournament. They must return the trophy at the next year's tournament and they will receive a smaller permanent trophy at that time.

The award will be awarded to the **SCHOOL** which shows the best sportsmanship, participation and general good behavior.

Above the competition, it is the desire of the Jaycees that courtesy, friendship, good behavior, and sportsmanship is fostered and maintained throughout the tournament. A signed statement may be submitted to the tournament chairman or member of the tournament committee by a basketball coach, cheer team coach, princess advisor or school administrator who has observed any unfavorable conduct by any basketball team, cheer team or princess. The statement must contain the date, time, and place of the offense. Written complaints will be reviewed by the tournament committee and upon acceptance of the complaint a school will not be considered for the award.

Points will be awarded as follows:

Coaches are rated by each referee on a scale of 1 through 5 for the first 2 games. Possible points earned would be 10 per game for a total of 20 points.

Teams are rated by each referee on a scale of 1 through 5 for the first 2 games. Possible points earned would be 10 per game for a total of 20 points.

Cheer teams are rated by our cheer team judges on a scale of 1 through 5 for the first 2 games. Possible points earned would be 5 per game for a total of 10 points.

Schools who bring a princess will be awarded 2 points.

Schools who enter a poster in the poster competition will be awarded 2 points.

Schools who enter a player in the hoop shoot will be awarded 1 point.

Total possible points awarded would be 55.

Exceptions:

Schools that do not have a cheer team or are not able to bring a cheer team will receive 4.5 points for the first 2 games or 9 points.

Schools are not officially rated or judged and do not receive more points for the third game. However, they can lose points if they display bad conduct and sportsmanship or a complaint is filed.
